Guidebooks for guided reading methods through tiered books have not been found in learning reading skills. Still, based on several previous studies, the impact of using guided reading methods and tiered book media is very effective in reading skills. Therefore, this study aims to develop a guidebook product for guided reading methods through tiered books to improve the reading skills of grade 1 elementary school students. This study used a Research and Development (R&D) approach using the 4D development model, focusing on the 3 stages of 4D development namely define, design, and develop. The research subjects comprised 1 grade 1 teacher and 32 grade-1 students at SD Negeri Sarirejo 1, Demak. The data collection technique used a questionnaire which was then analyzed and described to provide an overview of the feasibility and effectiveness of the guidebook. The product feasibility test was analyzed using percentages and the product effectiveness test was analyzed using the Wilcoxon Signed Rank Test, t-test, and N-Gain test. The results of the study explained that the guidebook for guided reading methods through leveled books was said to be feasible with a value of 92.4% from media experts, 92% from material experts, and 89.7% from practitioners. The results also provide an effectiveness value through a t-test with the value of the H_a t-test analysis accepted and the N-Gain obtained is 0.63. Thus, it can be explained simply that the guidebook for guided reading methods using tiered books is feasible and effective to be used by teachers to support Indonesian language learning, especially in reading skills.

ALIVE THE STORY OF ANDES SURVIVORS PIERS

Which is the best book about the Andes plane crash? MIRACLE IN THE ANDES
In October 1972, a plane carrying a Uruguayan rugby team crashed in the Andes. Not immediately rescued, the survivors turned to cannibalism to survive, and were saved after 72 days. Survivor, and rugby team member Nando Parrado has written a beautiful story of friendship, tragedy and perseverance.

Is the book *Alive* accurate? I was given a free hand in writing this book by both the publisher and the sixteen survivors. At times I was tempted to fictionalize certain parts of the story because this might have added to their dramatic impact but in the end I decided that the bare facts were sufficient to sustain the narrative...

What happened to the survivors of the movie *Alive*? Eight of the survivors, including Antonio and Liliana, are smothered to death by the snow.

Is there a book about the movie *Alive*? This plane crash adventure story concerns the Uruguayan rugby team whose plane crashed in the mountains. Forced to do whatever they needed to survive, they turn to cannibalism to stay alive. This ultimate story of survival is still compelling several years later.

How many of the Andes survivors are still *Alive*? It wasn't until two of them, Roberto Canessa and Fernando Parrado, climbed a 15,260 ft mountain peak and hiked for 10 days and approximately 38 miles without gear to seek help that the survivors were finally rescued. Today, in 2024, only 14 of the 16 survivors are alive.

What happened to the bodies of the Andes plane crash? Parrado protected the bodies of his mother and sister so they would not be eaten. They dried the meat from the bodies in the sun to make it easier to eat. At first they were so disgusted by the experience that they could only eat skin, muscle and fat, but in the end they also ate hearts, lungs, and even brains.

Did the Andes survivors suffer PTSD? "I think it's amazing that they've physically recovered, but also psychologically to recover," she said. "I'm sure that the PTSD from that experience and from having to make such a grim choice is something that

still lives with them."

Why didn't they light a fire in the Andes plane crash? The place where the plane crashed was not strategically visible, so it would have been pointless to try to make a fire. Furthermore, they didn't have enough flammable objects to cause such a big fire, which is why the lighter was used for cigarettes but never a signal fire.

How much of Alive is true? But unfortunately enough it all really happened, which makes the movie interesting to watch. For those who don't know the story yet, it is based on what happened to the Uruguayan rugby team during and after their plane crash in the middle of the Andes mountains in 1972.

Is the Andes plane wreckage still there? "What remains of the plane is still in a place where, in general, there is snow. It is at least 10 metres below where it was during the 72 days that the survivors were sheltered," says Moraga.

Who did the Andes survivors eat? A group of survivors lived through the plane crash, only to face the frigid cold and snow of the mountains, avalanches and, most famously, a lack of food. As they fought for their lives for more than two months, they fed themselves by cannibalizing the bodies of those who had already died.

How cold was it in the Andes when the plane crashed? Society of the Snow's real-world counterparts overcame an immense struggle. As well as battling against starvation, broken bones from the crash, and infected wounds, the stranded Uruguayan rugby team had to live through spells of cold that nosedived as low as -22° Fahrenheit. In Celsius, this figure comes to -30°C.

How did the Andes survivors get rescued? The survivors' initial note began, "I come from a plane that fell in the mountains." The authorities were notified, and on December 22 two helicopters were sent to the wreckage. Six survivors were flown to safety, but bad weather delayed the eight others from being rescued until the next day.

How long did the rugby team survive in the Andes? But in Society of the Snow, now streaming on Netflix, director J.A. Bayona (The Impossible, Jurassic World: Fallen Kingdom) tells the true story of how 16 members and supporters of a Uruguayan rugby team managed to survive 72 days in one of the world's harshest

environments by doing the opposite.

"D'autres gestes plus tactiles comme poser la main sur l'épaule ou toucher la main de l'autre invitent au contact et peuvent révéler l'envie d'un baiser" poursuit-il. Ces signaux sont assez courants et "parlants" pour que l'on perçoive l'attirance réelle de la personne qui se tient face à nous.

Quand un homme vous embrasse avec la langue signification ? D'après des études réalisées, si les hommes se livrent au «French kiss», c'est parce que la salive contient de la testostérone, qui augmente le désir sexuel chez leur partenaire. De plus, un baiser avec la langue permet à l'homme d'évaluer les niveaux d'œstrogènes

d'une femme et de juger de sa fertilité.

Comment on se sent quand on embrasse ? S'embrasser libère des hormones telles que l'endorphine (dite "hormone du bien-être") ou l'ocytocine (qui diminue le rythme cardiaque et la tension artérielle) et diminue le niveau de cortisol, ce qui fait office d'anti-stress, d'anti déresseur naturel... et diminue aussi les risques de maladie cardiovasculaire.

Comment sentir bon au niveau des parties intimes ? Choisissez un soin lavant intime adapté à la zone intime. Évitez les toilettes intimes excessives et les douches vaginales : une hygiène intime trop fréquente déséquilibre la flore vaginale et peut entraîner l'apparition d'infections vaginales dont les symptômes peuvent être des pertes vaginales malodorantes.

Comment faire pour ne pas sentir mauvais de la bouche ? Sortez la langue au maximum. Puis à l'aide d'une brosse à dents à poils souples (les grattoirs à langue ne sont pas conseillés), brossez de l'arrière de la langue vers l'avant afin d'enlever la pellicule blanche qui la recouvre. Vous y parviendrez en moins de 30 coups de brosse. Et l'effet du brossage durera 7 heures.

Comment embrasser une fille pour qu'elle n'oublie jamais ? Embrassez sa lèvre supérieure ou inférieure plusieurs fois. Lorsque vous ouvrez la bouche tout en l'embrassant, glissez le bout de votre langue entre ses lèvres et ramenez-la. Votre but est de toucher sa langue et de la toucher doucement. Ne tournez pas la langue dans tous les sens.

Comment savoir si il veut que je l'embrasse ?

Comment bien embrasser quelqu'un pour la première fois ? Utilisez surtout votre lèvre inférieure pour embrasser. Gardez vos lèvres relâchées et essayez de vous détendre. Embrassez-le longuement. Vous n'avez pas à faire quelque chose de compliqué pour attirer son attention la première fois. Votre but principal est de faire en sorte qu'il revienne quelques secondes.

Comment savoir quand c'est le bon moment pour embrasser ? Quels sont les signes qui indiquent que c'est le bon moment pour un premier baiser ? Pour déceler le "bon moment", un certain nombre de signes peuvent vous aider. Si la personne se

caresse les cheveux, a du mal à vous regarder ou sourit sans raison apparente, c'est très vraisemblablement l'instant propice.

Comment savoir si il a envie de t'embrasser ? Notre experte confirme : « La meilleure manière de savoir si un garçon veut t'embrasser est d'observer son langage corporel. S'il se penche vers toi quand tu parles, regarde tes yeux, te sourit ou te touche subtilement, cela indique qu'il pense à un bisou. » Prêtez l'oreille à ce qu'il dit.
