What does CL mean on a Bosch dishwasher? When the child lock is activated, the appliance will become unresponsive and the dishwasher door will be difficult to open. The only way to get the control back is by deactivating the child lock feature. This is very simple and requires minimal effort.

Why would a Bosch dishwasher stop working? Some common reasons for this issue are issues with the water supply, a faulty water inlet valve, a malfunctioning float, or the door switch that isn't working.
