Abstract: The paper investigates the teacher-student interactions during English lessons at SS III Public Schools of Katsina Metropolis. The reason that triggered the research was the mass failure of students especially at Senior Secondary Examinations. The paper used the constructivist theory as a theoretical framework. It also used teachers' and students' questionnaires, a Target Language Observation Scheme (TALOS) and audio recorded lessons in the schools observed as instruments for data collection. Six schools were examined out of twelve. A total number of 6 teachers and 132 students were selected as the sample of the study. All six teachers were observed, and the lessons were recorded at different times. Simple Frequency Counts and Percentages were the basis used for the analysis of the data collected. The findings revealed that teacher-student interactions need to be improved as teachers gave room for the students to participate in the interactions but unfortunately, they remained idle in the class. A structured questionnaire was used to collect information on sociodemographic characteristics. Anthropometric indices which include body adiposity index (BAI), abdominal volume index (AVI), Conicity index (CI), a body shaped index (ABSI), a body shaped index z score (ABSI z score), hip index (HI), body roundness index (BRI) and ponderal index (PI) were measured. Socio-demographic result shows that age, occupation and monthly income were found to be significantly associated between the urban and rural participants whereas education, number of children and pregnancy status were not significantly associated. Urban and rural participants had a significant association in BAI (p=0.006), AVI (p=0.010), HI (p=0.030), BRI (p=0.003) and PI (p=0.002). There were no significant association in CI (p=0.219), ABSI (p=0.498) and ABSI z score (p=0.680). Further investigation of these indices and their association with nutritional status and different diseases could assist in efforts to prevent unfavorable health conditions among women of reproductive health.

GLOBAL SALAFISM ISLAMS NEW RELIGIOUS MOVEMENT

What are the new Islamic movements? Contemporary revivalist currents include Jihadism; neo-Sufism, which cultivates Muslim spirituality; and classical fundamentalism, which stresses obedience to Sharia (Islamic law) and ritual observance.

What is the Salafism in Islam? Salafism: Salafism is the idea that the most authentic and true Islam is found in the lived example of the early, righteous generations of Muslims, known as the Salaf, who were closest in both time and proximity to the Prophet Muhammad.

What is the new religious movement? A new religious movement (NRM) is a religious, ethical, or spiritual group or community with practices of relatively modern origins. NRMs may be novel in origin or they may exist on the fringes of a wider religion, in which case they will be distinct from pre-existing denominations.

Is Islam the newest major religion? Islam, a monotheistic and Abrahamic religion, is the second largest faith in the world after Christianity, with about 1.8 billion

Muslims worldwide. Though Islam's roots go back further, scholars typically date the creation of Islam to the 7th century, making it the youngest of the major world religions.

What is Wahhabism in Islam? For more than two centuries, Wahhabism has been Saudi Arabia's dominant faith. It is an austere form of Islam that insists on a literal interpretation of the Koran. Strict Wahhabis believe that all those who don't practice their form of Islam are heathens and enemies.

Is Mufti Menk a Salafi? Menk has been identified as a Deobandi as well as a Salafi.

Is Wahhabism same as Salafism? Ahmad Moussalli tends to agree Wahhabism is a subset of Salafism, saying "As a rule, all Wahhabis are salafists, but not all salafists are Wahhabis." Quintan Wiktorowicz asserts modern Salafists consider the 18th-century scholar Muhammed bin 'Abd al-Wahhab and many of his students to have been Salafis.

Who founded Salafism? Salafism originated in the mid to late 19th Century, as an intellectual movement at al-Azhar University, led by Muhammad Abduh (1849-1905), Jamal al-Din al-Afghani (1839-1897) and Rashid Rida (1865-1935).

What is the world rejecting new religious movement? The World Rejecting New Religious Movement (NRM) is one of Roy Wallis' three types of New Religious Movement. As the name suggests, their orientation to wider society is one of rejecting most of what that society stands for. Wallis' World Rejecting NRMs are closely related to Troeltsch's category of the sect.

Why do people join new religious movements? New religious movements provide an alternative family to the individual due to the strong sense of commitment and the community that they create.

Is La Catrina a God? Her name is La Catrina and the essence of her story goes deep into Mexican traditions and roots but has been restyled only in the last century. It is believed that the Aztecs worshipped a goddess of death that they alleged protected their departed loved ones, helping them into the next stages.

What is Catrina slang for? Posada's Calavera dons a fancy hat – in the European style and her name 'Catrina' comes from the slang 'catrin' which referred to a well-dressed man or woman.

What does Catrina mean in English? They also represent the family's willingness to celebrate life in honor of their loved one's death. Catrina is a Spanish word that

translates as little corpse. It derives from the Italian word Caterina, which means little girl.

What is a Mexican skeleton called? A calaca (Spanish pronunciation: [ka?laka], a colloquial Mexican Spanish name for skeleton) is a figure of a skull or skeleton (usually human) commonly used for decoration during the Mexican Day of the Dead festival, although they are made all year round.

Who drew La Catrina? We know that the image most commonly known now as La Catrina was created by José Guadalupe Posada. We know this simply because Posada signed the printing plate on the lower right-hand side. But to date, no one knows for certain of the first appearance of the image.
