Or if you are going for informal greeting then it goes same as in Hindi, i.e Namaste. To ask people how they are doing in Gujarati, you should say: Kem Cho? Kem cho - ??? ?? (How are you?)

What is the main religion in Gujarat? The major religions followed are Hinduism, Jainism and Buddhism. Muslim Religion, Christianity, Parsi, Sindhi and other many more religions are followed with faith all across Gujarat. Since ancient times, Gujarat is noted for its temples.
