Guidebooks for guided reading methods through tiered books have not been found in learning reading skills. The data collection technique used a questionnaire which was then analyzed and described to provide an overview of the feasibility and effectiveness of the guidebook. The product feasibility test was analyzed using percentages and the product effectiveness test was analyzed using the Wilcoxon Signed Rank Test, t-test, and N-Gain test. The results of the study explained that the guidebook for guided reading methods through leveled books was said to be feasible with a value of 92.4% from media experts, 92% from material experts, and 89.7% from practitioners. The results also provide an effectiveness value through a t-test with the value of the H_a t-test analysis accepted and the N-Gain obtained is 0.63. Thus, it can be explained simply that the guidebook for guided reading methods using tiered books is feasible and effective to be used by teachers to support Indonesian language learning, especially

in reading skills.
