Why did Anne write in her journal? Anne Frank received her diary as a gift on her thirteenth birthday in 1942. At first, it was her place to record observations about friends and school and her innermost thoughts. But when she and her family went into hiding the month after the diary began, it became a war document.

Why was Anne Frank's journal important? Anne Frank's story has influenced people's opinion of the Holocaust as much as any other work of art. The reason being that is shows the inhuman victimization of the Jews during the Holocaust. It also shows that the belief that people are basically good no matter how horrendous their acts, can be reason for hope.
