In Judaism, the Sabbath is the seventh and the sacred day of the week, a recurring seven-day temporal unit. The concept of Sabbath influenced the Christian Sunday and the Muslim Friday, and with the expansion of both, the seven-day week became a globally common temporal unit. As such, the Sabbath is identified with two highly influential ideas: the seven-day week institution of cyclical temporality almost disconnected from nature, and the dichotomy of sacred and profane days. The Jewish Sabbath is famously introduced by the first biblical story of creation, as God sanctifies the seventh day and rests from his labor of creation. Therefore, some etymologists suggest the Hebrew word Shabbat is derived from rest (Shevita), and some point to its similarity to the number seven (Sheva). However, the information in the Bible regarding the Sabbath is limited and deals mainly with the prohibition of labor. It is only by the Second Temple period and later in rabbinical writings that the Sabbath is seen as a day of communal worship, complex practices, rituals, and limitations that are not directly related to cessation from work. The academic scholarship on the Sabbath, which is the focus of this bibliography, usually concentrates on contextualizing the elements of the Sabbath to specific periods and locations. Thus, academic scholarship does not present the Sabbath as a whole, but instead picture it as a multilayered social institution, gradually developed across thousands of years, with no clear starting point and, of course, as ever changing. Already by the end of the 19th century and the first half of the 20th, the "Sabbath question" was an urgent scholarly discussion regarding its Mesopotamian origins, its parallels in other cultures, and the idea of the week. Through these debates, the specific Jewish concept became a universal category for thinking of time, society, and religion. Moreover, the academic scholarship created a direct link between the Jewish concept of Sabbath and the Christian concepts of Sunday and the seven-day week. Therefore, instead of leading to difference and confrontation, as in earlier periods, the Sabbath became a Judeo-Christian idea, separating this group from the

rest of the world. In the second half of the 20th century, scholarship shifted from the big question of origin to more minor aspects of it, shading light on the different stages of Sabbath development, like the Second Temple period, classical rabbinic writings, and Kabbalah. It seems that the last centuries present the popular current phase of the Sabbath as a rest day in capitalist and secular modern societies. A unique case here is the formation of the modern State of Israel, which recreated the Sabbath as a national rather than a religious category, being another intriguing turn in the relationship between the Sabbath and Jewish identity.

POVERTY YOUTH AND RURAL URBAN MIGRATION IN ETHIOPIA

How is poverty different in urban and rural areas in Ethiopia? "Poverty in urban areas fell from 26% in 2011 to 15% in 2016. Conversely, progress was more modest in rural areas, with a decrease in poverty from 30% to 26% over the same period," said Carolyn Turk, World Bank Country Director for Ethiopia, Eritrea, Sudan and South Sudan.

Why do you think people usually migrate from rural to urban areas in Ethiopia? One-off major droughts encourage both temporary-distress migration and permanent migration. Permanent migration is employed as it allows people to

escape livelihoods which depend on the availability of water but is also a strategy for managing drought.

What is the main cause of migration in Ethiopia? The causes are diverse, from climate shocks and shifting economic conditions to conflict-induced displacement. This report explores how the scale and characteristics of cross-border movement are evolving post-pandemic, featuring case studies from different world regions.

What are the major causes of underdevelopment in Ethiopia rural urban? The causes of poverty in Ethiopia are the same as they are in most other Less Developed Countries (LDCs). An over-reliance on agriculture, a lack of infrastructure, war, poor education, and trivial levels of livelihood diversification are all to blame.

In what ways is poverty different for urban versus rural youth? Rural poverty often stems from limited access to markets, education, quality infrastructure, employment opportunities, health, and financial products. Urban poverty is often marred by weak or hazardous living conditions related to sanitation, employment, and personal security.

What is the cause of poverty in Ethiopia? It should also be noted that around 80 percent of Ethiopians depend on agriculture as their primary means of livelihood. The severe arid conditions caused by lack of rainfall, as well as civil disputes, tends to increase the number of people who are affected by poverty.

What country has the highest rural to urban migration? China. China's population is thought to have seen the largest rural-to-urban migration flows in history. Since the 1980s, national economic reforms have increased taxes related to food production and increased the scarcity of available farmland.

What caused migration from rural to urban areas? During the 1700s in Europe and the 1800s in the United States, many citizens moved from rural areas to urban areas to find work or economic opportunities, to join family, or to obtain personal freedoms. They also may have been escaping conflict, poverty, famine, or oppression. Why do people move away from Ethiopia? In addition to a large refugee population, Ethiopia has more than 3,779,000 internally displaced people (IDPs). Rapid urban expansion, ongoing conflicts within Ethiopia and high levels of vulnerability to ongoing drought and seasonal floods continue to generate new displacements yearly.

What is the migration trend in Ethiopia? An estimated 839,000 Ethiopians migrated abroad in the past five years, with 78 per cent aged between 15 and 29 years. Close to 31 per cent of these migrants travelled to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia while South Africa, United Arab Emirates, United States, and Yemen, were popular destinations.

What is the migration crisis in Ethiopia? Incoming refugees set to drive up demand in border areas More than 100,000 refugees and Ethiopian returnees have crossed into Ethiopia from Sudan since fighting erupted in April 2023, putting pressure on refugee camps in the border region of Benishangul-Gumuz.

Why do Ethiopians immigrate? People may decide to leave the nation in order to get away from social unrest, political upheaval, or persecution. Family reunification is another important factor, since Ethiopians who have already immigrated to the United States can encourage and assist the immigration of their relatives.

What are the common problems faced by rural youth in Ethiopia? Rural youth make up the majority of Ethiopia's population, yet they face significant barriers to employment. Factors like land scarcity due to population pressure, lack of rural job opportunities, and minimal access to education and skills training restrict their ability to find stable livelihoods.

How much of Ethiopia lives in poverty? Six in 10 Ethiopians (61%) experienced moderate or high levels of lived poverty during the past year, up from 54% recorded in 2020 (Figure 5). About one-third (34%) experienced low levels of lived poverty, while only 6% did not experience any shortages of basic necessities.

What are the consequences of poverty and inequality in Ethiopia? Poor people in rural areas face an acute lack of basic social and economic infrastructure such as health and educational facilities, veterinary services and access to safe drinking water. Households headed by women are particularly vulnerable.

How is poverty different in rural areas than urban areas? Rates of poverty are higher in rural areas compared to urban areas. According to the United States Department of Agriculture Economic Research Service, in 2019 15.4% of people living in rural areas had an income below the federal poverty line, while those living in urban areas had a poverty rate of only 11.9%.

Is Ethiopia more rural or urban? Ethiopia is still predominantly a rural country, with only 20% of its population living in urban areas.

What are the determinants of poverty in rural Ethiopia? The result revealed that lower farm productivity, old age of the head, lower prices of the outputs, bigger household size, lack of infrastructure, and dependency ratio were the major determinants of poverty, whereas the education of the head was inversely related to poverty.

Why is Ethiopia the least urbanized but rapidly urbanizing? This can be for two main reasons: first, the fertility rate in Ethiopia was still high while it declined in other African countries; Secondly, increase in urban growth is rapid initially, when the level of urbanization starts from low level.

At the end of the designated period, there was a veritable boom in the domestic motorcycle market, with the Nipponese advertisements owned a significant role to promote this training market. This boom of the Brazilian motorcycle industry would not be possible without the involvement of a consumer youth because, in a context of economic downturn, young, newly in the labor market or the financial help of parents were consumers of large amounts motorcycles. The return in terms of income from advertisements of Honda and Yamaha was visible: in full deceleration of the Brazilian economy between the late 70's and the following decade beginning in the twentieth century, the two Nipponese factories could not meet the growing demand. This pent-up demand generated the development of the domestic motorcycle market over the next several decades. What is House of Leaves by Mark about? What does the house represent in House of Leaves? Of course, both houses can be seen as representations of mental illness, in which case I would argue there is still that pervasive 'horror' just in a different sense (i.e the fear of illness via hereditary pathways) especially in the case of Johnny in House of Leaves.

Is House of Leaves about trauma? Mark Z. Danielewski has combined textualization and typography in his complex novel House of Leaves as a unique attempt to represent trauma in the space between language and written language.

Is House of Leaves postmodern? The novel House of Leaves by Mark Z. Danielewski exhibits many characteristics that could place the novel neatly within the realm of the literary theory postmodernism. The publication history of the novel, its format, and the two narratives within it all contain elements which seem postmodern.
