THOUGH it is the most important book in the religious life and the culture of the English-speaking world, the King James Bible or Authorised Version of 1611 has never been perfectly printed. This is not to say either that it is badly printed or that absolute perfection can be achieved, but that the text and its presentation can be improved. First, what we now read as the King James Bible contains numerous deliberate and some accidental changes to the text, and these can be revised to make it more faithful to the King James translators' own decisions as to how it should read. Second, the presentation of the text – spelling, punctuation and formatting – interferes with the clarity with which it speaks to the minds and souls of present-day readers. Unnecessary background noise gets in the way. To use another image, there is dust and dirt on the old master, the paint is darkened and cracked: we can still see that the picture is a great one, but not how great it is. This article continues to explore the criteria used behind the publication of this new work.

The Need for Identification and Prevention.

Case: A 26-year-old first-year psychiatry resident presents for rounds on her first day of a child consult-liaison rotation. She is anxious to begin the rotation because she will be working with an attending psychiatrist who is known as being difficult to please. The resident presents the case of a child in the emergency room to the attending, a second-year child and adolescent psychiatry fellow, and several medical students. The resident who is presenting the case begins to notice that the attending makes eye contact only with the fellow and then asks him to present the assessment and plan for the patient she just has presented. Using “herself as an instrument” to pick up on subtle interpersonal dynamics, the resident senses that the attending is annoyed with her and that she is not doing a good job on her first day.

Bullying is prevalent amongst all students, but especially in individuals with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Previous research has shown that individuals with ASD or other developmental disabilities report being bullied more than individuals without disabilities. However, there has not been much previous research on how to teach these individuals to respond to bullying. This study's purpose was to use behavioral skills training (BST), an evidence-based practice in applied behavior analysis (ABA), to teach adolescents with ASD how to respond to bullying. The results of this study showed that the participants learned how to respond to bullying using BST in scenarios presented by the main experimenter.

Bullying remains a significant social problem among youth and many school interventions focus on increasing bystander defending in order to reduce bullying. In this study, we employed a between-groups experimental design to examine the differential effects of brief empathy and compassion activation on different bystander responses to bullying, including (1) empathic distress, empathic anger, compassion,

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and (2) intended bystander behaviors (i.e., passive bystanding, aggressive defending, and prosocial defending). Participants were 110 adolescents ($M_{\text{age}} = 13.99$, $SD = 0.88$, age range = 13–16 years; 49.1% females), randomly assigned to an experimental group that involved a 10-min visualization exercise that focused on increasing empathy [EM] or compassion [CM], or to an active control condition [FI]. Following the visualization exercise, students viewed four short bullying videos, followed by completing self-report measures of empathy-related responses and intended bystander behaviors. Analysis of variance [ANOVAs] revealed that adolescents in the CM condition reported less empathic distress and empathic anger in response to the bullying videos than the EM and FI groups. Yet, there were no further differential effects between the three conditions on responses to the bullying videos, which emphasizes the need for future research to assess more comprehensive interventions for increasing adolescents' compassion and prosocial defending.

Bullying is prevalent in many schools worldwide. Providing bullying prevention training to preservice teachers can make a significant difference in preventing school bullying. There is a lack of training in bullying prevention for preservice teachers in China, and the effectiveness of such training for bullying prevention has not yet been established. The present study examined the effectiveness of bullying prevention training on antibullying self-efficacy and incorrect beliefs about bullying among Chinese preservice teachers. A total of 139 preservice teachers ($M_{\text{age}} = 20.76$

years, SD = 0.80 years, ranging from 19 to 23 years; 90.6% women) were randomly assigned to the bullying prevention training (n = 73) or the control group (n = 66). Preservice teachers completed pre- and posttraining surveys. The participants in the treatment group completed a 5-week bullying prevention training program (1.5 h per week). Measures of antibullying self-efficacy and incorrect beliefs about bullying were used to evaluate the effectiveness of the bullying prevention training. Results indicated that the training increased preservice teachers' antibullying self-efficacy but did not decrease their incorrect beliefs about bullying. Practical implications, limitations, and future directions of these findings are discussed.

These are ensured using monetary policy and fiscal policy as tools to address the fluctuations that emerge in the short run.

How do I get a BMW owners manual? You can access your BMW owner's manual by downloading the Driver's Guide app or using the Know Your BMW online tool which generates personalised guide and videos.

How do I find an owner's manual for my car? Most local dealerships can sell you a replacement manual through the parts department, and some offer online ordering.

A cost-saving option is to check online for hardcopy availability from the general public (i.e.: Ebay, Craigslist) or third-party vendors (like Helm, Inc).

Can you order an owner's manual? Almost all automakers have made owner's manuals available on their Web sites. All of the online owner's manuals are free, while the paper versions cost anywhere from \$25-\$40. Below is a list of links to help you get an online manual from a car's manufacturer.

Where can I download user manuals for free? ManualsLib is a major platform to search manuals and user guides. For many devices, ManualsLib offers different types of documents (user guides, installation instructions, fast start guides, spec lists, maintenance manuals, etc.). Use filters to search guides by type of document, manufacturer, and type of device.

Why did BMW stop making manuals? In an interview with Italian-language magazine Quattroruote, BMW board member Frank Weber confirmed M's stick shift days are numbered. "They are fun products, but let's be honest, the volumes are getting smaller and smaller," Weber told Quattroruote. "And so it doesn't make sense to develop them anymore.

What if my car doesn't have an owner's manual? Can I order a new owner's manual for my used car? The other option is to order a new owner's manual. You'll have to go to the manufacturer's site to order one of these. You could possibly buy one second-hand off an online buy-and-sell site, but you may be better off going directly to the source.

What if I lost my owner's manual? If you're looking for a physical replacement copy, you can often simply buy another copy online. Searching a site such as eBay or Amazon will often provide you with used and new manuals in a range of price points. You can also order a replacement manual from some automakers.

Where can I download my car's owner's manual? Owners' Manuals Click on a logo to go to your car manufacturer's official website. There, you can download the manual.

How much does an owner's manual cost? Prices vary and typically are \$30 or more. Manuals for some vehicle models are available on CDs.

Where would you find the electronic version of a vehicle's owner's manual?

The manual is typically stored in the vehicle's infotainment system, which is the central hub for audio, navigation, and other features. To access the manual, you'll need to use the infotainment system's touchscreen or physical controls.
