He's called 'the world's greatest' and often compared to Paganini for his virtuosity. There is a certain purity to his sound that makes him stand out easily from other first-rate jazz guitarists."

**Was Joe Pass classically trained?** Back to Joe Pass. No, not classically trained, but an innovator who is to Jazz guitar what Tarrega was to the classical.

**How did Joe Pass learn guitar?** Joe Pass's Life and Career Raised in a working-class Italian-American family, Pass found solace in music from a young age, teaching himself to play the guitar by listening to records of jazz guitar greats such as Charlie Christian and Django Reinhardt.

**Did Joe Pass have children?** Joseph Anthony Passalacqua (Joe Pass), guitarist: born New Jersey 13 January 1929; married (one son, one daughter); died Los Angeles 23 May 1994.

**Where did Joe Pass live?** Pass was born in New Brunswick, N.J., and raised in Johnstown, Pa., where he started lessons at age 9 on a \$17 guitar. By the late 1940s, he was working jazz clubs in New York City, but his career sputtered when he got involved with drugs.

**Was Joe Jackson ever in a band?** Joe Jackson Band In 1978, a record producer heard Jackson's demo tape and signed him to A&M Records. **What Gibson did Joe Pass play?** "I've stuck with the same basic kind of Gibson, like the model I play now, an ES-175," Pass told Guitar Player in 1976. "It's the only kind of electric I've ever played when I had the chance. I've had this one since my Synanon days.

**How good was Joe Pass?** Pass may well have been the first electric jazz guitarist to possess the technical facility to hold his own among the sax and piano players of the time, but it wasn't just about speed. His ideas were so melodic and well crafted; it was never just a series of fast scale-runs.

**Who taught Paul McCartney how do you play guitar?** Born in Liverpool, McCartney taught himself piano, guitar, and songwriting as a teenager, having been influenced by his father, a jazz player, and rock and roll performers such as Little Richard and Buddy Holly.
